Anti- Bullying Week

I would just like to remind you that next week is Anti-Bullying Week and we have some special activities planned. One of these is a special show which will take place on Thursday afternoon. On Friday, we will have a Yellow Day, when the children can come in own clothes but should wear something yellow, even if it is a small item. We are collecting money for the Kidscape charity, who work with schools to help prevent bullying, as they have been involved in projects with the school recently, so please bring in a donation next Friday.

RE Week

I would also like to remind you that during the week beginning 23rd September we will be holding RE week. During this week we will be focusing on refugees and collecting items to send to The Jungle camp in Calais. We are collecting items of warm clothing such as jumpers, socks, woolly hats and gloves, as well as toiletries and toys for children. We will be taking them to the Southwark Refugee Project on Friday 27th as they are taking a consignment over to Calais that weekend, so please do not bring in items after 27th November.

Football Festival

This week was the turn of KS1 to go to a Football Festival to play alongside other Southwark schools.
