Sports Premium Report 2016-17

The income from the Sports Premium was £9,309 in the year 2016-17.

The money was spent in the following ways:

Subscription to Bacon's College for consultancy, training and provision of extra-curricular activities such as football, rugby and netball leagues	£6,300
After school training clubs in football, netball, basket ball with PE specialists	£2,220
Overtime for teaching assistants to take to competitions	£500
Equipment for all sports after school clubs	£280
Total	£9,300

Impact

The sports premium has had a big impact on reviving the sporting life at St. Paul's. St. Paul's School sent teams a number of competitions organised by the Bacon's Partnership. Aside from the rugby, football, basketball and netball leagues, they also provided competitions for all year groups from 1- 6 to participate in. Groups of children were taken to rounders and athletics tournaments from year groups across the school.

St. Paul's have had considerable success for the first time this year. Our netball and basketball teams came second in the league for the whole of the borough of Southwark, and we also came third in the Southwark rounders competition. Our Dance Club (which is not funded from Sports Premium) came third in a Southwark competition. One of our Year 6 children was "spotted" to play in a Southwark league team.

Given the popularity of football, it is disappointing for our pupils that we have not had similar success in the football league. Although we have won some matches, we

have not managed to register success overall in the league. This is something we will aspire to improve in the coming year.

All classes have one PE session with a sports specialist (as part of PPA cover). These specialists run after school clubs in the sports that we are fielding teams for, and it is this which is paid for by Sports Premium Funding. This has proved very effective in improving participation and attainment in sport in the school, and therefore will remain the key focus of our spending of Sports Premium Funding.

Although this has been an expensive way to raise standards in PE, this is being assisted by a culture of success. Children at St, Paul's love PE and being active, as our playground testifies. Bacon's College and our PE leader provide training opportunities to staff, to increase our skill set and capacity to teach PE within the school staff.
