School Improvement Focus: Governor Monitoring

Governors have been working alongside the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) to develop their role in supporting standards across the school. Monitoring that has happened in the last month has included; governors looking at safeguarding procedures to ensure all children are safe at school, and an outcomes monitoring where the end of term data was looked at and questioned. Governors question Senior Leaders and then write reports about their area of monitoring, these reports are shared with all governors at the next Full Governing Body Meeting (FGB's). All governors are committed to the Journey of Improvement that St Paul's is on. They echo the improvements recognised by the HMI inspector in November 2018.
