Home learning:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development Emotional

- Begin to understand how others feel.
- Show confidence in new situation
- Turn taking and sharing.
- Play with one or more children, extending and elaborating play ideas.

Physical Development

- Become more independent with dressing and undressing.
- Begin to show different ways of moving on different equipment.
- Being able to throw and catch a large ball.
- Using one-handed tools confidently, (scissors)

Communication and Language

- Develop listening and attention skills.
- Be able to talk about books and retell them.
- Understands why questions.
- Use a wide range of vocabulary.
- Use longer sentences.
- Use talk to organise themselves in play.

Literacy

- To begin to use letter knowledge in writing.
- Write some or all of their name.
- Write some letters accurately.
- Read letters by saying the sound of them.

Mathematics

- Be confident with recognizing numbers 1-5/1-10.
- Make comparisons between objects.
- Notice patterns and arrange things in patterns.
- Understand positional language.

Understanding of the World

- To know there are different countries.
- Notice differences between people.
- Explore the world around them.
- Describe what they see, hear and feel.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Explore different materials.
- Show an interest in musical instruments
- Draw with more detail (circle for a face).
- Use resources to develop on their role play.
