

ENGLISH

PHONICS:

We will have daily phonics sessions where the pupils will review the old sounds, learn a new sound, practice words which include the new sound and practice writing these words.

READING:

Pupils will read a range of stories, retelling them and considering their particular characteristics. The Digger and the Flower - We will learn about the environment from these characters. Tidy- A lovely text which links to our Science topic of plants.

WRITING:

Pupils will be focussing on writing in role, using adjectives and verbs in their writing, writing retellings and their own versions of stories that have been shared in class. Texts include: Lost and Found- Children will write about friendship and feelings linked to this text. I Want My Hat Back- Children will write letters, diaries and a retelling of this story. Julian is a Mermaid - a text linked to our Capital and Culture topic of Beside the Seaside.

SCIENCE AND COMPUTING

SCIENCE:

Seasonal changes- Pupils will observe changes across the four seasons with a focus on Summer. Plants- We will investigate and identify different plants and trees. Working Scientifically - We will complete investigation linked to topics covered this year.

COMPUTING:

Beebots - Children will be introduced to early programming concepts. Introduction to Animation - Children will use ScratchJr. to begin to animate.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Alongside daily collective worships, pupils will learn about the unit 'Why is it important to listen to and remember the stories Jesus told?' In this unit they will learn more about the messages in the stories Jesus shared. In the second part of the Summer term they will complete the unit 'What does It mean to be a Muslim?'

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

INDOOR SESSION:

Pupils will be working on their gymnastics skills and learning to play net games.

OUTDOOR SESSION:

Pupils will develop their athletics skills and how to problem solve within games.

WELL-BEING

Pupils will have work on the Friends Resilience programme 'Fun Friends'. During these sessions we learn about how to be a good friend, develop self-control and turn 'red thoughts' into 'green thoughts'. Our Well-being lessons have a strong link to our school intent 'To keep safe and well.'

MATHEMATICS

Pupils will develop their number and reasoning skills in many contexts including practical lessons, challenges and group and independent work. Pupils will also develop their mathematical language and be able to explain the steps they took to get their answer.

Children will complete the following blocks, Multiplication and Division, Fractions, Position and Direction, Place Value (within 100), Money and Time.

CAPITAL AND CULTURE

Our topics this term are, 'Wacky Weather' and 'Beside the Seaside'. Children will learn about historical events to do with weather, how clothing (for different weathers) has changed over time and they will find out about Robert Hooke who invented the rain gauge. Geographical work will include, locating hot and cold areas of the world using maps and atlas' and learning about physical and human features of the seaside,

ART:

Pupils will investigate windmills, what they are used for and to create their own using different materials. In the second half term they will explore shape, shades and patterns using different materials to create a seascape

MUSIC:

Pupils will learn the songs for each of the church services held at St Paul's Church. They will also be able to compose and perform a musical poem about the sea.
