- Move slowly, safely and silently around the school


OFSTED

As you know, we had an OFSTED inspection at the end of last term. Thank you so much to all of you for your feedback in parent view. The anonymized report was extremely positive. Although the timing was far from ideal, we are delighted with the outcome. When a school has an OFSTED inspection, we are told the outcome at the end of the second day. However, we are not permitted to share the outcome as there is a quality assurance process to confirm the grades given. As the previous OFSTED inspection at St Paul's in 2018, judged the school to be inadequate, this process was more rigorous than usual. I am delighted to tell you that the final report has now been approved and will be attached to this newsletter. I am delighted that the report recognises so many strengths of St Paul's as a school, as well as the strong leadership across the school in so many areas. I hope you enjoy reading it \mathfrak{S} .

We have already started working on the two areas for improvement. We are continuing to review our curriculum with the OFSTED feedback in mind. We now have a new music room which is well equipped with tuned and untuned percussion as well as djembe drums. Every class now has a weekly music lesson and every Tuesday we have a whole school singing collective worship. The Gospel choir will continue but after half term we will be starting another school choir where the children will be able to sing other genres of singing. Later in the year all children in Yr 4 will learn to play the recorder. We are also going to be starting new after school clubs for Sewing and cookery, so watch this space.

Parents as partners in your child's education

Parental engagement refers to teachers and schools involving parents in supporting their children's academic learning. The Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) found that Parental engagement has a positive impact on average of 4 months' additional progress. We were really pleased that so many of you did come to the meetings this week to meet your child's teacher but also to learn what your child will be learning this year and how you can support them. The diagram below shows that the child is the top priority in all we do at school and all you do for your child at home. The stronger the arrow at the bottom in terms of relationships and communication between school and parent, the better the progress and well-being for the child. Year 5 and Year 6

Children in year 5 and year 6 are allowed to travel home by themselves if you feel it is safe for them to do so. This does prepare them for transition to Secondary school. If you do want your child to go home alone please inform the office who will let the teacher know. We strongly recommend that you explain to your child how to keep themselves safe when travelling to and from school. As parents sometimes want their children to have mobile phones for safety and communication reasons, children in Year 5 and 6 are allowed to bring their mobile phones to school. On arrival, they must put their phones in the phone boxes on the gate. The phones will be returned to the children at the end of the school day. Children in the younger year groups are not allowed to bring mobile devices to school and this includes wrist devices, other than a watch. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

We would like to warmly welcome Mr Aron to St. Paul's. Mr Aron is our new Year 4 teacher, I am sure you will all make him feel welcome. Miss Batchelor is now Acting Deputy Head, while the recruitment process is underway to appoint a substantive Deputy Head at St Paul's.
