Routine appointments during school time

If your child has a hospital or specialist appointment please bring the letter to the office where a copy can be placed in their file as proof of authorised absence. Illness

We can arrange for this in school if necessary. Please discuss these arrangements with the school. Please note, that our school policy is to make contact with parents if we receive an email or a voice message regarding absence from school. If your child requires medication in school, you will need to complete a permission form for us to admister the medication at the school office. Please do not send your child to school with medication in their bags unless the permission paperwork has been done.


Spotlight on Chestnut Class

In Year 5, the children have just started using the new Crumble Kit controllers. This electric controller connects to a computer using a USB cable and the children are able to programme it to do various things, such as attaching an LED light to the controller and programming it to change colours and flash.

Physical computing involves programming digital devices to sense and interact with the world – an engaging alternative to screen-only activity. By the end of this unit the children will be able to: Understand the impact physical computing has in the real world and create block-based programs to control the Crumble.

Year 3 have been taking part in ukulele lessons every Thursday with Miss Hanson. The joyous sounds of ukuleles fill the air as Redwood eagerly immerse themselves in their music lessons. With fingers dancing across the strings, their faces light up with smiles of pure delight. Each strum brings a sense of accomplishment and excitement as they learn to create melodies. In these ukulele lessons, creativity knows no bounds. Year 3 are able to experiment with a variety of rhythms and have the opportunity to make up their own tunes. This is definitely the highlight of their week.





Spotlight on Larch Class

Larch class had a fantastic day at the British Museum on 8th May. The children were looking for artefacts pertaining to their topic this term, the Ancient Egyptians, they were not disappointed! The children were particularly blown away by the Mummies!

The whole class were fantastic ambassadors for St Paul's. Thank you so much to the parents who supported on the day.









Spotlight on Ash Class

In Science, Ash Class have started learning about 'Living things. The children have discussed what the words 'living', 'dead' and 'never alive' mean and used MRS NERG to help us to identify the things that all living things can do. The children worked in groups to sort cards into living, dead and never alive, with a focus on explaining 'why' with reference to MRS NERG e.g. This piece of paper is dead because it used to be alive when it was part of a tree, but now the tree is dead.

In English, Ash Class have started learning about 'The Great Fire of London'. They have been pretending to be townspeople living in London during the great fire and giving each other commands about what to do in the event of a fire. The children have focused on using the conjunctions 'when', 'if', 'because' and 'or' to extend our commands e.g. Evacuate your house if you smell smoke!

In Capital and Culture, Ash Class have started learning about 'Brilliant Britain'. For History, they have been thinking about what London is like now and comparing it to what it was like in 1666. They worked in pairs to complete a 'zone of relevance' for London 'Now' and London 'Then', where we had to sort adjectives into the zones based on how much they matched London at the time. For Geography, the children have been looking at pictures/maps of the countryside/city and comparing life in both with a focus on human/physical features. The children have been considering where they would rather live and explaining why.

In Maths, Ash Class have started their learning about 'Fractions'. Many of the lessons have been practical where the children are using resources to physically find a quarter of an amount. They then moved on to drawing pictures and then finally to use the mental method of 'half and half again'.
